- Formerly Incarcerated community members (returning citizens)






% of Clients per Department




% of Workshops taken per Department




Client Race/Ethnicities



Client Languages





Restoring Economic Mobility










Empowering Communities

Building Connections and Inspiring Change

The Youth Department has been vibrant and active, launching the Youth Peer Leadership Program filled with a variety of engaging activities and events. The youth built creative events like the "Brushes for Love - Paint and Snack" gathering, which brought the youth community together for an evening filled with painting, fun, and connection. Educational programs included visits from Strategies for Youth and BARCC, focusing on legal education and bystander intervention. The department's commitment to community well-being was highlighted by the inaugural 3x3 Basketball Throwdown at Norfolk Park, aimed at promoting peace and addressing gun violence. With the summer program underway, the Youth Department is offering a range of activities from STEM workshops to community gardening, all designed to keep our youth engaged with their neighborhoods and keep our streets safe.



Success Story: "You Matter" at Suffolk County Corrections

We brought our You Matter and Financial **Empowerment programs to Suffolk County** Corrections, where inmates eagerly participated in educational activities. Gabby Roggy, Family Advocate at MJE, shared, "The inmates love learning educationbased skills. They love participating. They love our staff. They were excited as soon as they saw our flier. They value us coming in and giving them the opportunity to reflect who they want to be, and remind them that they matter." The enthusiasm led to many earning certificates in Financial Literacy, fostering a sense of accomplishment. President & CEO Monalisa Smith emphasized the importance of restorative justice, stating, "Some people make mistakes, and some don't have the same resources as others," highlighting MJE's focus on addressing the root causes of crime and promoting healing and rehabilitation.

"Some new skills that I've learned would be team building exercises, so if I'm at my school or even my home, I can gather my family or gather some students together and I can talk about stuff. MJE really helped me find my voice to do what I need to do." - MJE Peer Leader



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
